

Brown Township Noise Resolution Resident Survey Report

July 2025

Executive Summary

Brown Township's character has long been defined by a balance between rural tranquility and everyday activity. The proposed Noise Resolution before the Trustees seeks to preserve that balance by distinguishing between normal, short-lived sounds of community life and the disruptive, chronic noises that erode residents' sense of peace. In June of 2025 the Trustees mailed 1,596 postcards, inviting household within the township to complete a survey designed to gauge community sentiment and to surface practical concerns. Nearly two hundred households—representing both the incorporated and unincorporated portions of the Township—responded.

The survey paints a nuanced picture. A clear majority report a generally quiet or acceptable soundscape, yet a meaningful minority describe persistent disturbances. Those who rated their environment "Noisy" most often point to gunfire, revving engines, amplified music, and construction equipment. Importantly, even among respondents who consider present noise levels tolerable, many agree that having a sensible ordinance would clarify expectations and give law-enforcement a workable standard.

A series of follow-on questions explores depth of concern. Most residents have at least once been disturbed by noise, and a substantial share believe that unchecked noise can undermine property enjoyment and neighborhood cohesion. When asked how important it is that disruptive noise be addressed, respondents overwhelmingly rate the issue as very or somewhat important. They favor quiet hours that limit high-volume activity overnight while preserving reasonable freedoms during the day. This mirrors the draft resolution's core provision: a nighttime quiet period from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. coupled with an objective "plainly audible at 300 feet" test. The proposed resolution also exempts agricultural, emergency, sporting, and other customary activities, a nuance that resonates with commenters who fear over-regulation. The Ohio Revise Code requires certain exemptions that have been properly included in the draft resolution.

Support for the resolution is strong in principle but qualified by pragmatic questions. Some residents in the unincorporated area express skepticism about enforceability and potential costs. Others, particularly in the incorporated subdivisions, worry about rare but egregious late-night events and see the resolution as overdue. Several respondents advocate an educational phase before citations begin, emphasizing neighbor-to-neighbor communication. A smaller group voices philosophical opposition to any additional regulation, invoking personal freedom and existing state laws.

Taken together, the data suggest that Brown Township residents value quiet enjoyment of their property and are open to targeted, reasonable measures to curb disruptive noise. They favor clear definitions, modest quiet-hour limits, and a balanced approach that respects both rural traditions and residential peace. The findings imply broad conceptual support for adopting the resolution, provided its enforcement focuses on egregious violations and preserves customary daytime activities. The report that follows translates the survey into actionable insights, presents detailed response distributions, and captures the authentic voices of residents through curated comments.















Q10: Final comments on the proposed noise resolution

Final Comments – Incorporated

I really like the overall idea, but some important items need re-examining: (1) The core prohibition targets noise that "annoys or disturbs the comfort, peace, or health of a person of ordinary sensibilities". This creates a variable standard that depends on the complainant and the enforcing officer, which can be difficult to prove and defend against in court. The noise should be measures in decibels against a standard. Make it easy on law enforcement subjectivity just makes it harder (and more dangerous) for them to do their job. (2) Prohibiting the operation of a radio or TV "with louder volume that is necessary for convenient hearing for the person or persons who are...voluntary listeners" is unenforceable from a practical standpoint. An officer outside a home cannot determine what volume is "necessary" for the occupants inside. Again, just measure the volume of the noise in decibels against values in a chart. (3) The exemption for "incidental noise such is made by construction operations, repairs, or maintenance of houses or yards" is vague. "Incidental" is not defined, and unlike many noise ordinances, this resolution does not specify permitted hours for construction (e.g., 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.), which could lead to disputes over early morning or late evening work. There's a theme here - minimizing ambiguity is better for everyone involved: the complainant, the potential violator, and law enforcement. (4) The resolution states it is a "prima facie violation" if noise is "plainly audible" at 300 feet from the property line. A presumption of guilt is probably taking this too far. It should just be a standard violation. The only way this should stay is if there is a decibel measurement, just like (5) A second-degree misdemeanor is far too harsh for a noise violation. It should be a minor misdemeanor for first violations and fourth-degree misdemeanors for subsequent violations. This isn't shoplifting or vandalism. [118898235936]
